- Claims of winning prizes requiring upfront fees
- Requests for taxes or processing payments
- No legitimate prize delivered

Romance and friendship scams

- Online relationships built over time
- Emotional manipulation followed by financial requests
- Claims of emergencies or financial hardship

Tech support scams

- Pop-ups or calls claiming device issues
- Requests for remote access
- Charges for unnecessary or fraudulent services

Warning Signs of Senior Scams

Most scams follow recognizable patterns.

Watch for:

- Urgent demands for immediate payment
- Requests for payment via gift cards, wire transfers, or cryptocurrency
- Unsolicited contact asking for personal or financial information
- Messages designed to create fear, panic, or pressure
- Requests to keep the situation secret

If something feels suspicious, pause and verify before taking action.
