Warning Signs You Should Never Ignore

Elder abuse is often subtle in its early stages. Paying attention to changes can help families intervene sooner.

Watch for:

- Unexplained bruises, cuts, or recurring injuries
- Withdrawal from social activities or relationships
- Changes in mood, appetite, or sleep patterns
- Poor hygiene or signs of neglect
- Unusual financial transactions or missing funds
- Fear or anxiety around a particular caregiver

If something feels wrong, trust your instincts and investigate further.

Who Is Most at Risk?

Certain circumstances can increase vulnerability to abuse.

- **Social isolation** — limited contact with others
- **Cognitive decline** — dementia or memory impairment
- **Physical dependence** — reliance on caregivers for daily needs
- **Caregiver burnout** — overwhelmed or unsupported caregivers
- **Financial vulnerability** — limited oversight of finances

Identifying these risks early allows families to put safeguards in place.
