Romance Scams

- Create fake profiles on dating or social sites.
- Spend weeks or months gaining trust.
- Then claim a sudden emergency, medical crisis, or travel problem and ask for money.

Love and compassion are weaponized, and by the time the truth surfaces, the financial and emotional damage can be serious.

Tech Support Scams

A pop-up flashes: "Your computer is infected!" Or someone calls claiming to be from a well-known tech company.

They may:

- Ask for remote access to a computer.
- Request payment for fake repairs or software.
- Install programs that steal information silently.

Once inside, they can see passwords, accounts, and personal files.

Warning Signs of Senior Scams: What Should Raise a Red Flag?
