Prize and lottery scams

- Claims of winnings requiring upfront payment

- No actual prize provided

Romance scams

- Online relationships built over time
- Emotional manipulation followed by financial requests
- Claims of emergencies

Tech support scams

- Pop-ups or calls claiming device issues
- Requests for remote access
- Charges for unnecessary services

Senior Scams: Warning Signs to Watch For

Most scams share common red flags:

- Requests for immediate payment
- Demands for gift cards, wire transfers, or cryptocurrency
- Unsolicited contact asking for personal information
- Fear-based language designed to create urgency

- Requests for secrecy

If something feels suspicious, pause and verify before responding.
