Why Scammers Often Target Seniors

Common Senior Scams in Henderson

Phone Scams

Those “urgent” phone calls that pop up out of the blue? They’re a classic. Scammers may pretend to be:

- Government agencies
- Utility companies
- Banks

They often:

- Use caller ID spoofing to look official.
- Demand immediate payment.
- Threaten legal trouble or service shutoffs.

- “Pay taxes or fees before you receive your prize.”
- “Send gift cards as processing costs.”

In reality, there is no prize—just a clever way to get money.

Romance Scams

Online companionship can feel like a lifeline for someone lonely—but it can also open the door to emotional manipulation. Romance scammers:

- Build trust over weeks or months.
- Share dramatic personal stories.
- Suddenly face “emergencies” and ask for money.

By the time the truth comes out, the emotional and financial damage can be huge.

Tech Support Scams

These usually start with:

- A pop-up claiming “Your computer is infected!”
- A caller saying they’re from a well-known tech company

They may:

- Ask for remote access to the computer.
- Charge for “repairs” that aren’t needed.
- Install malware or steal sensitive information.

If a problem appears out of nowhere and demands instant action, it’s worth taking a step back.

Warning Signs of Senior Scams

Scams often follow a familiar script. Watch for:

- Urgent demands: “Act now or lose everything!”
- Pressure to pay in unusual ways: gift cards, wire transfers, cryptocurrency.
- Requests for secrecy: “Don’t tell your family; they’ll just worry.”
- Unsolicited messages asking for personal info, passwords, or account numbers.
- Messages that stir up fear or panic, like threats of arrest or lawsuits.

If something feels off, that gut feeling is worth listening to. Pause, hang up, or close the message and get a second opinion.

How Families Can Help Protect Loved Ones in Henderson
