Warning Signs That Something's Off

- Urgent requests for money or personal details.
- Pressure to pay with gift cards, wire transfers, or cryptocurrency.
- Messages that demand secrecy.
- Threats, fear, or panic meant to rush a decision.
- Unexpected calls, emails, or texts from "official" sources.

If something feels fishy, trust that feeling. Pause, verify, and don't hand over information on the spot.
