What Is Elder Abuse?

Elder abuse happens when an older adult is harmed—or put at serious risk of harm—by someone they rely on for care or trust for support. Sometimes it's a clear, intentional act; other times, it's a harmful failure to act.

Common Forms Include

- **Physical abuse** – hitting, pushing, rough handling, or misuse of restraints.
- **Emotional abuse** – yelling, threats, humiliation, name-calling, or isolating a senior from others.
- **Financial exploitation** – taking money or valuables, misusing accounts, pressuring for “loans” or changes to legal documents.
- **Neglect** – not providing enough food, hygiene, clothing, or medical attention.
- **Abandonment** – leaving a senior alone without the support they clearly need.

Elder abuse doesn't always look like bruises or shouting. Sometimes it shows up as quiet neglect, subtle control, or unexplained money problems.

Warning Signs Families Should Watch For

Abuse rarely announces itself with a flashing sign. It often starts small, then slowly ramps up. That's why staying alert to changes can make all the difference.

Watch for:

- Unexplained bruises, cuts, burns, or frequent falls.
- Sudden withdrawal from friends, hobbies, or family.
- Unusual sadness, anxiety, or fearfulness.
- Poor hygiene, dirty clothing, or unsafe living conditions.
- Rapid weight loss or changes in eating or sleeping habits.
- Missing cash, valuables, or strange charges and withdrawals.
- A senior who seems nervous, quiet, or guarded around a certain person.

If your gut says, “Something's off,” don't brush it aside. That little voice might be onto something.

Risk Factors That Can Increase Vulnerability

Some situations put seniors in a tougher spot and make abuse more likely. We can't change everything, but we can

reduce risk once we know where to look.

Higher-risk situations often include:

- **Social isolation** – few visitors, limited outings, or being cut off from friends and neighbors.
- **Memory problems or confusion** – [dementia](<https://alwaysbestcare.com/leland/resources/preventing-wandering-in-seniors-dementia-safety-tips-for-leland-caregivers/>) or cognitive decline that makes it hard to report or remember events.
- **Physical limitations** – needing help with bathing, dressing, walking, or toileting.
- **Financial dependency** – someone else managing all money, with little oversight or transparency.
- **Caregiver stress or burnout** – overwhelmed caregivers who don't have enough support.

By tackling these risk factors early—more connection, more support, more oversight—we help create a safer day-to-day life for our loved ones.

Stay Present and Involved

Watch the Money

- Review bank statements and bills with your loved one.
- Keep an eye on new “friends,” sudden loans, or surprise changes in wills or accounts.

Build a Circle of Support

- Involve trusted neighbors, friends, and faith or community groups.
- Stay in touch with professional caregivers, doctors, and other providers.

Support the Caregiver, Too

- Notice signs of burnout: exhaustion, irritability, withdrawal.

- Share the load with respite care, in-home aides, or short breaks.

The more eyes, ears, and hearts are involved, the harder it is for abuse to hide in the shadows.

- Take photos of visible injuries if it's safe to do so.

Reach Out for Help

- Contact local Adult Protective Services.
- Speak with their doctor or another trusted healthcare provider.

- Call law enforcement right away if you believe your loved one is in immediate danger.

- Arrange more frequent check-ins from family or friends.
