Prize and Sweepstakes Scams

These scams promise a big win, then ask for fees, taxes, or "processing costs" before the prize can be claimed. Spoiler alert: there's no prize.

Romance Scams

A scammer may build trust online, then suddenly need money for an emergency. Heartstrings get pulled, and sadly, that's often the whole game.

Tech Support Scams

A pop-up or caller may claim a computer is infected or broken. Next comes the request for remote access or payment for repairs that were never needed in the first place.

Warning Signs We Shouldn't Brush Off

Red Flags That Often Show Up

- Requests for urgent payment
- Demands for payment by gift card, wire transfer, or cryptocurrency
- Unexpected messages asking for personal information
- Threats, fear, or nonstop pressure
- Secrecy, especially if someone says not to tell family

If something feels off, it's worth pausing. Better safe than sorry.
