- **Odd payment methods:** Gift cards, wire transfers, or cryptocurrency are requested.
- **Pressure tactics:** Fear, panic, or guilt is used to push a quick decision.
- **Requests for personal details:** Bank info, Social Security numbers, or account passwords are asked for out of the blue.

If something feels off, it probably is. Better safe than sorry.

Phone Scams

[A scammer may pretend to be a government worker](<https://alwaysbestcare.com/longview/resources/protecting-seniors-from-scams-2020/>), a utility rep, or even a grandchild in trouble. They count on emotion to cloud judgment.

Email and Text Scams

Fake messages can appear to come from banks, doctors, or well-known companies. One click, and boom, someone could be stealing private information.

Sweepstakes and Prize Scams

"You've won!" sounds exciting, but the catch is usually a fake fee or tax payment. In reality, there's no prize at all.

Romance Scams

A scammer builds trust online, plays the long game, and then asks for money once the

emotional bond is set.

Tech Support Scams

Pop-ups and phone calls may claim a device has a serious problem. Then comes the pitch for remote access or payment for a “fix” nobody asked for.
