Tech Support Scams

A pop-up or phone call may say there's a problem with a computer. The scammer then asks for remote access or payment for fake repairs.

Warning Signs That Something's Off

- Urgent demands for money
- Requests for gift cards, wire transfers, or cryptocurrency
- Messages asking for personal or financial information
- Threats, panic, or pressure
- Instructions to keep the matter secret
