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Why Seniors in Rockville Are Often Targeted

Scammers don't pick names at random; they look for people they think they can pressure or confuse. Older adults may be targeted because they:

- Tend to be trusting and courteous, even with strangers
- Have savings, retirement income, or home equity
- Living alone makes them easier to isolate and influence
- Aren't as familiar with digital scams, fake websites, or spoofed phone numbers

Put all that together, and it's easier for a scammer to strike up a conversation, build quick "trust," and then twist that trust into something harmful.

Common Types of Senior Scams

Phone Scams

A caller may claim to be:

- A government official
- A utility company representative
- A bank employee
- A grandchild or relative in trouble

They often:

- Create urgency ("You must pay now or lose benefits!")
- Demand immediate payment or personal information
- Try to keep the senior on the line

Email, Text, and Phishing Scams

Messages may appear to be from:

- Banks or credit card companies
- Healthcare providers or pharmacies
- Online retailers or delivery services

Red flags include:

- Suspicious links
- Requests for sensitive information
- Spelling errors or unusual email addresses

Sweepstakes and Lottery Scams

Seniors may be told they must:

- Pay fees before receiving winnings
- Provide financial information

In reality, there's no prize; the [money goes straight to the scammer](<https://alwaysbestcare.com/rockville/resources/protecting-seniors-from-fraud/>).

Romance Scams

Scammers:

- Build emotional connections over time
- Avoid meeting in person
- Eventually request money due to "emergencies"

Tech Support Scams

These scams may involve:

- Fake virus warnings or calls
- Requests for remote computer access
- Charges for fake services

Warning Signs of Senior Scams

Watch for:

- Urgent payment demands
- Requests for gift cards, wire transfers, or cryptocurrency
- Unsolicited contact requesting personal information
- Threatening or high-pressure messages

If something feels off, pause and verify with a trusted source.
