Romance Scams

These scams play on trust and emotion. A scammer may build a relationship online, then suddenly hit up the victim for money because of an "emergency."

Tech Support Scams

A pop-up or phone call may claim a device has a serious problem. Then, the scammer pushes for remote access or payment for fake repairs.

Warning Signs That Something's Off

Watch closely for these clues:

- Urgent requests for payment
- Pressure to act right now
- Demands for gift cards, wire transfers, or cryptocurrency
- Requests for personal or banking details
- Secretive behavior, like being told not to tell family

If something smells fishy, pause and verify before doing anything.
