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Why Seniors in Shreveport Are Often Targeted

Put all that together, and it's easier for a scammer to build false trust, push emotional buttons, and nudge someone into sharing information or sending money.

Common Senior Scams Families Should Know

Here's where the rubber meets the road. If we know the classic plays, it's much easier to call them out and shut them down.

1. Phone Scams

The phone rings, and on the other end is:

- Someone claiming to be from Social Security, Medicare, or the IRS
- A “utility company” threatening to shut off power
- A “grandchild” or “relative” in trouble and begging for money

They often:

- Create urgency: “You must act right now.”
- Demand payment or personal details on the spot.

If it sounds rushed, intense, or too dramatic, that’s a big red flag.

2. Email and Phishing Scams

[These messages may look polished and legitimate](<https://alwaysbestcare.com/shreveport/resources/protecting-seniors-from-scams-2020/>), but they’re wolves in sheep’s clothing. They may:

- Pretend to be from a bank, pharmacy, hospital, or package delivery service
- Contain links that lead to fake websites
- Ask for account numbers, passwords, or Social Security numbers

One quick click, and suddenly, private information is out in the open.

3. Sweepstakes and Lottery Scams

“Congratulations, you’ve won!” Sure sounds nice, doesn’t it? The catch:

- The “winner” must pay taxes, fees, or processing costs upfront.
- The scammer may ask for banking information “to deposit the prize.”

In reality, there’s no prize, just money flowing in the wrong direction.

4. Romance Scams

Loneliness is powerful, and scammers know it. They:

- Build a relationship online or through social media.
- Spend weeks or months gaining trust.
- Suddenly face an “emergency” and ask for money, often more than once.

By the time the truth comes out, both the heart and the bank account may be hurting.

5. Tech Support Scams

A pop-up flashes: "Warning! Your computer is infected!" Or a caller claims to be tech support. They might:

- Ask for remote access to the computer.
- Charge for fake repairs.
- Install software that steals passwords or personal data.

Any time a stranger wants access to a device, it's time to hit the brakes.

Warning Signs of Senior Scams

Scams often follow a familiar script. If you spot these moves, it's time to pause and double-check what's going on.

Watch for:

- Demands for immediate payment or urgent action
- Requests to pay with gift cards, wire transfers, or cryptocurrency
- Unsolicited calls, emails, texts, or messages asking for personal or financial information
- Messages that stir up fear, panic, or guilt
- Pressure to keep the situation secret from family or friends

If [something feels off or confusing](<https://alwaysbestcare.com/shreveport/resources/protecting-seniors-from-fraud/>), that gut feeling is worth listening to. Better to stop and verify than rush and regret.
