Nutrition plays a big role too. When an older adult isn't getting enough protein, vitamins, minerals, or fluids, their body may struggle to repair damaged skin. So a wound that looks minor at first can quietly turn into a stubborn problem.

What Types of Wounds May Need Skilled Nursing Care?

Not every cut needs a nurse, and that's good news. But some wounds really should be checked and handled by a skilled professional.

Skilled nursing for wound care is often recommended for:

- **Surgical incisions** that need close monitoring
- **Pressure injuries or bedsores**
- **Diabetic foot ulcers**
- Wounds tied to **poor circulation**
- **Skin tears** that are slow or difficult to heal

- **Burns** or more serious injuries
- **Chronic wounds** that aren't improving as expected

A healthcare provider can assess the wound, determine the level of care needed, and provide clear instructions for home treatment.

Warning Signs a Wound Needs Medical Attention

Sometimes a wound looks fine at first, then quietly starts heading in the wrong direction. Families can help catch problems early by watching for red flags like:

- Growing **redness, warmth, swelling, or pain** around the wound
- New or increased **drainage**
- A **strong or unusual odor**
- Changes in the wound's **size, color, or depth**

Whole-body changes can be even more serious, including:

- Fever or chills
- Confusion or unusual sleepiness
- Sudden drop in overall strength or energy

For seniors with diabetes, circulation issues, or a weak immune system, things can go downhill fast. If any of these warning signs show up, don't wait—reach out for medical help quickly.

- Using cushions or special mattresses to relieve pressure
- Supporting good eating and drinking habits

Caregivers can keep an eye on common pressure points like the:

- Heels
- Hips
- Tailbone
- Elbows

Catching redness or soreness early around these areas can stop a small problem from turning into a painful pressure injury.

Home Health and In-Home Care: A Strong Partnership

Skilled nursing takes care of the medical side of wound care, but healing isn't only about bandages and medicine. Many seniors also need day-to-day support while they recover.

In-home caregivers can help by:

- Preparing nutritious meals
- Assisting with bathing, dressing, and personal care

- Providing reminders for medications
- Noticing changes and sharing concerns with family or healthcare providers
